6.1 Grammar

can / can't, must / mustn't

(LA SEMANA PASADA VIMOS EL SIGNIFICADO DE ESTOS VERBOS MODALES Y CÓMO SE USAN. A CONTINUACIÓN, INCLUYO UN RESÚMEN)

CAN / CAN'T (PODER)

Usamos CAN / CAN'T para hablar sobre habilidad y permiso.

PERMISSION: *Can I open the window?* (¿puedo abrir la ventana?) / *He can't go to the party* (Él no puede ir a la fiesta).

ABILITY: *I can speak English* (puedo hablar inglés) / *Can you play an instrument?* (¿Sabes tocar un instrumento?)

*Note: Siempre usamos el infinitivo sin 'to' después de CAN / CAN'T.

He can ride a bike. NOT ~~He can to ride a bike.~~

MUST / MUSTN'T (DEBER)

Usamos MUST / MUSTN'T para hablar sobre obligación y prohibición.

OBLIGATION: *I must get up at 7.00 a.m* (debo levantarme a las 7 de la mañana) / *They must wear a uniform* (deben llevar uniforme).

PROHIBITION: *You mustn't talk in the library* (no debes hablar en la biblioteca) / *We mustn't use our phones in class* (no debemos usar el teléfono en clase)

*Note: Siempre usamos el infinitivo sin 'to' después de MUST / MUSTN'T.

You must wear goggles. NOT ~~You must to wear goggles.~~
